## **2021** - What a year!



As we reflect on what has been another unprecedented year, and my first as Head Teacher, we have experienced and achieved so much at Lakeview: children, parents and staff all working together. There have been many challenges along the way but the successes and celebrations have far outweighed these.

On our return to school last January, day one saw us go into lock down – yet again. Parents became teachers once more, and worked with children and staff to ensure that learning continued throughout spring. Whilst in lock down, school was open and 25% of our children were in attendance to enable key workers to attend work and support the pandemic.

With a return to school in March, our 3Rs curriculum enabled the children to enjoy being back with their friends. They engaged in outdoor learning and enrichment whilst learning about the Census and our local community through our Reset, Rediscover, Rebuild curriculum. I remember the children being so excited to eat lunch together in the hall – as it had been so long since they had done so.

In the summer term, as Boris announced our exit from lockdown, Covid cases locally began to increase and presented incredibly trying times for us all. Not least in the last few weeks of the summer term when there were three year groups all self-isolation.

We also had our first Ofsted visit as a team. They acknowledged our strengths and validated the plans we have in place to develop our school. We have many exciting developments in progress, the first of which have already been introduced: French is now taught across the whole school from Nursery to Year 6, Forest school is part of the EYFS and KS1 curriculum, and our new Music curriculum was introduced in November.

September saw school being open 5 days a week, following our request for parent feedback. Stunning Starts and Fabulous Finishes were introduced – to 'hook' the children into learning with engaging activities to kick start the topics, and to celebrate their learning at the end of term. Music instrumental lessons were also back up and running with violin, keyboard, drum and guitar all on offer. Extra-curricular clubs and school visits have re-commenced and school performances have been showcased to parents.
