Thank you to all parents who attended our remote parent consultations during the week of 8<sup>th</sup> November 2021. We had an excellent response and consultations were held with parents for 78% of pupils over the two days. The teachers conducted 186 parent appointments on Monday and 168 appointments on Thursday. ### **Year 1 November Learning Newsletter**

In the last few weeks the children in Year 1 have been looking at their local area and then began to compare it to Russell in New Zealand. The children blew us away on our field trip around Wixams and made sure to show our school values when walking around our local community. The children were then introduced to the terms human and physical features and began to use the correct vocabulary when talking about the similarities and differences between Wixams and Russell.





In English, we have been focusing on the book Monkey Puzzle. The children have loved reading this book and were able to retell the story to their peers. They made sure that when they were retelling the story that we were using the correct vocabulary from the book. The children did this so well that they then began to act out the story and performed it in small groups to the rest of the class.


