The first six weeks of 2022 has seen us experience continual changes in staff and pupil attendance due to Covid. This has not deterred children from being the best they can be and working hard to learn.

Developing reading at Lakeview

Our whole school development plan is well under way with our primary curriculum focus this term on developing reading across school for both 'pleasure and purpose' for learning. During the first six weeks, we have focused both, with children in class, and with staff during professional development on sessions to develop the teaching of reading, as well as sharing our love of reading. We now have daily Everyone Reading in Class (ERIC) time where children and adults spend time reading a book of their choice for pleasure. Our new library is now open – and all children are visiting at least once each week to read, learn and choose new books. We now have discrete daily reading lessons, focusing on fiction, non-fiction and poetry to increase and develop our understanding of language and vocabulary.

Please encourage your child to read at home, and even better, share a book with them — regardless of their age. Children can record the reading they have completed, in their reading journal or planner as teachers will discuss this with them each Friday morning.

Parent communication and dates for this term

Having spoken with a number of parents over the last few days, we are aware that there is some frustration due to the timing or lack of communication to inform parents about events and information occurring this term. In particular, changes to the PE days, made at the end of the half term period have not been communicated to all parents in a timely manner and this has resulted in some confusion. I apologise for any upset and frustration caused as a result of the communication issues and assure you that we are striving to improving communication and parental engagement between school and carers.

All communication will be issued electronically and published on the school website. Booking information for termly extra-curricular clubs, and parent consultations will be emailed with a link, and booked on School Cloud.

During the summer term, we will ask for parent feedback specifically on these communications and their timings. In addition we will be asking for feedback on our revised behaviour policy, homework, clubs, trips and residentials in preparation for the next academic year.
